The PE Funding Allocation for 2017/18 will be: £19560

For the year 2017/18 we have been allocated £19,560 to spend on improving our PE provision at SSSJ. We are using our sports funding to:

- * Embed and implement the new PE scheme throughout the whole school, based on the new national curriculum guidelines.
- * Hire specialist PE coaches to teach the new PE scheme, alongside our staff, as a valuable staff training programme.
- * Teach children all the essential skills they need to be able to take part in competitive sports and games in each area of the PE curriculum.
- * Train teaching staff to develop their confidence and knowledge in teaching.
- * Build on the wide range of existing after schools we currently run by introducing new after school clubs. This will provide the children with even more opportunities to participate in a wide range of sports and activities such as tri-golf, self-defence and street dance.
- * Replenish, update and add new resources and equipment ensuring high quality PE lessons are sustained. New equipment will also enable even more sports and activities to be delivered.
- * Provide the children with opportunities to participate in internal and external sports competitions to increase participation in competitive sport.
- * Raise the profile of PE by inviting different sporting companies into school for themed days and links to IPC topics.
- * Hold sports days across school to allow children to experience competitive sport and increase participation.
